Beginning in 2008, Andries competed in the Skip Barber National Championship Series, for which he was awarded a scholarship, where he handily won 11 out of 14 races and scored podium finishes in the remaining three earning him both the Skip Barber Summer Race Series Championship and "Rookie of the Year" honors. In 2010, Andries split his time between Skip Barber and the Star Mazda Championship competition.

He moved full time to the Star Mazda Series in 2011, placing third in season point standings, helping Team Pelfrey secure the Team Championship in its first season of operation.

Andries made his Firestone Indy Lights debut for Bryan Herta Autosport at the 2012 Toyota Grand Prix of Long Beach. Firestone Indy Lights is the premiere ladder series for drivers and teams striving to compete in the IZOD IndyCar Series and the Indianapolis 500. In 2013, he began competing in the Pro Mazda Championship Presented by Cooper Tires for JDC Motorsport.

An honor student and captain of the wrestling team at Pinellas Park High School until graduation, Andries studies mechanical engineering between racing opportunities at St. Petersburg College.
